

## ROADSIDE FIND

We were heading to Aberdeen, SD on I-94. We turned south on Highway 281 about ten miles when we noticed a 50's vintage Buick on the side of the road.



The Buick was a two-door hardtop with a Dyno Flow transmission. It appeared to have all original parts on the car and the interior was also complete. This would be a good restoration project car revitalizing this rare find.

It appears to be a 1950-52 Special or Super distinguished by its three "ventiports". The Roadmaster would have sported four ventiports to distinguish itself as a top-of-the-line Buick. This car would be a Riviera hardtop. These cars were "built", hoods would clang down like a manhole cover. It was said that the dash of a Buick had more steel in them than an entire Subaru car.
