They have come up with several descriptions of items that would be featured with a plaque or sign putting a name on the item and what it does. They have a good start on a big project. Just to let you know, your Prez is really a 16-year-old with fifty years of experience. Apply that theory to Joe LaFave and you will see he has a lot of experience!!

I have been getting questions relating to winter storage of your classic car. I did some research resulting in 10 items we should perform in preparation for storing the car for the winter.

- 1. Review the insurance plan making sure the plan is up to date or check if there are better options available.
- 2. Check your storage space. Place a vapor barrier on the concrete floor to prevent moisture from reaching the undercarriage of your car.
- 3. Clean the exterior of the car. Apply a liquid base coat of protective wax. Lubricate door hinges and hood hinges. If you have a convertible, store it with the top up to prevent fabric shrinkage.
- 4. Clean the inside of the car. Scraps can attract unwanted pests. Vacuum and clean surfaces with a treatment. Place a box of baking soda inside to absorb unwanted odors that can develop.
- 5. Prep the tires. Use soapy water and a tire brush to wash off the dirt and brake dust. Check the PSI and fill if needed.
- 6. Change the oil in your vintage, especially if it has the original engine. Go for a short drive to circulate the new oil throughout the system. This will help prevent internal corrosion.
- 7. Fuel up. Do not use any ethanol-based fuel since it attracts moisture. The new fuel blends also deteriorate over a short period of time so add a conditioner to maintain fuel integrity.
- 8. Cover the tailpipes to prevent rodent infestation or use steel wool as a plug. Don't forget to remove it in the spring.
- 9. Use a battery tender to prolong the life of the battery. This will prevent any battery drain that may occur.
- 10. Check on your car and warm up your car periodically.

PAC MEMBER CAR STORY - CAR ITCH by Ken Stoxen



The car itch is a terrible bug to catch. I had a 1953 Ford Victoria for almost 20 years; sold to a guy in Iowa. Empty garage. 6 months and the bug hit me. I came across a 1968 Mercury Cougar in Lincoln, nice car, great speed; but you know us old guys, have a hard time getting in and out of the low cars. Empty garage. One day I got bored so I did some cruising on the computer to get my bidding number for the Hemmings car auction.

The car auction "online" is quite intense for about 3 days. Being close to the computer at home gave me a good opportunity to raise the bid to essentially push the other bidders in the ditch. And wouldn't you know as luck would have it…I got the final bid and needed to send earnest money to Hemmings.

Now this car is 50 miles north of Duluth, MN or about 1,000 miles from Mandan. I sent a picture of the car to my girlfriend and told her we were doing a road trip in November to the northern part of MN. Remember the winter of 2022? Well, she said "Nope"! Now I gotta figure out how to get this 1928 Model A in my empty garage.

A 2011 Dodge truck is not really good on gas mileage and the food bill would be over the top if I took my twin boys along. Calling around for car transporters was almost the same as car auction bidding. I finally found one transporter Thanksgiving morning at about 10 a.m. Yes, I did say Thanksgiving Day morning. As luck would have it ...10 p.m. Thanksgiving evening I opened the garage door, watched and waited as my 1928 Model A came rolling up the street in the enclosed trailer!

The driver didn't know how to start the engine or locate the reverse. As fast as I could, I jumped in the car and had her in the garage in 10 minutes flat. Checking the A over, I would need to replace the tires (they were made in 1981), new radiator and all those other little things that creep up on ya.

I went to register the 1928 Model A at the Dept. of Transportation; a young girl behind the counter asked what "model" it was so naturally I said Model A. She looked in her book but could not find it so the model is listed as Unknown. At some point this will be changed.

I've been a car guy since I was 16. First car was a 1937 Ford two door Humpback. When I was 21 I brought my oldest daughter home in a 1960 Ford Convertible blue and white. Heading down the road a couple years later, the second daughter came home in a 1967 Pontiac GTO Convertible 400 3/2. Daughter #3 her ride wasn't as classy, 1974 F-150 Ford pickup. 




