## **CAR STORY - The Long Ride Home by Bruce Rittel**

#### Coincidence is God's way of remaining anonymous. ~Albert Einstein



The journey started with my purchase of a 1987 Nissan Pulsar T-top, the perfect sexy car except for one thing — the powder-blue body. Easy to fix, right? Paint it black. But what began as a simple paint job soon developed into a new friendship and a discovery beyond my imagination.

My quest to turn this little car into a sleek, black, speed machine led me to Archie, a local mechanic and body man. Unlike me, Archie breathed, smelled, and dreamed about cars; all cars - - fast, old, muscle. His passion for life and easy smile were contagious, and many afternoons I looked forward to just shooting the breeze with him. We'd talk about everything from family to sports to politics.

One day, while we were chatting away in his shop, Archie shared his excitement about a fast, old car he found online. Moments later, he pulled up the site, and before I knew it, the two of us were having an intelligent talk about -- of all things -- muscle cars. Internally, I laughed at the picture of me -- a fifty-two-year-old widower and longtime federal office employee -- sitting in a hot, stuffy garage discussing muscle cars with a fifty-something man who was as excited as a kid with a new Christmas toy!

I mentioned that Archie's smile was contagious, but his excitement must have been too. Perhaps that's why, two nights later when my favorite show turned out to be a re-run, I sat down at my computer and pulled up Archie's online site. Eight o'clock on a Thursday night, and I was looking at muscle cars for sale!

The site listed twenty-six pages. By the time I reached page six, I was bored and ready to call it quits when a blue '65 Mustang caught my eye. My younger brother-in-law, Scott, once owned a car just like it. Out of the blue, only weeks earlier I had thought about that car. I even contacted Scott's dad to see if it still sat in his barn, only to discover Scott sold it several years earlier. Though he loved the car, Scott never found the time to fix it up. So, when I saw that Mustang and read that the car sat for nearly thirty years in a barn, I was curious. Could this be Scott's old car?

Of course, I called the number listed in the ad. And after a few questions, I was certain it was my brother-in-law's old car. Chills ran down my spine. Okay, so what's the likelihood that I'd recently thought of that car and then accidently found it online? The car price sounded reasonable; the car just needed some body work, but, hey, I knew Archie. The only real glitch was another potential buyer planning to purchase the car in two days.

I needed to make a quick decision, but my intentions that night hadn't included buying another car. To be sure I had the right vehicle, I contacted Scott's sister, Tammy, in Montana. Minutes later, after questioning her, I was convinced.

I called the seller back and bought the car. What a great surprise this would make for my brother-in-law, now confined to a nursing home. Scott suffered a work-related accident two years earlier that resulted in a coma and rendered him paralyzed with little hope for recovery.

With excitement I called my sister-in-law again and explained my plan. Dead silence. After a moment she said, "Bruce, the first owner of that car was not Scott. It was a hand-me-down. Dad bought that car for Tracy, and she learned how to drive on that Mustang."

My head started spinning. Tracy, my wife, died five years ago.

As I talked to Tammy, another idea popped into my head. Instead of simply showing Scott the car, I would put that Mustang into top condition and then give Tracy's first car to her dad. With Christmas just months away, that would make a great present.

Then I had yet another thought. To add to my gift presentation to Tracy's dad, I would place the Mustang key in a special ornament box -- one that Tracy gave him. When she was alive, each Christmas for ten years, Tracy bought her dad a Hallmark car ornament. The year she died, the Hallmark series abruptly stopped. Two weeks before that Christmas, I remembered Tracy's tradition, and decided I would complete her dad's collection since she was gone. I scouted the whole state until I found that year's ornament.

For this Christmas, we'd wheel Scott to the nursing home parking lot to see the car, and we'd hand Tracy's father his last gift to open -- the Hallmark ornament box with the car key inside. To Tracy's mother, we'd present a scrapbook that contained pictures of the car's progressive makeover as well as a picture of sixteen-year-old Tracy standing in front of her first vehicle.

My heart overflowed with warm thoughts, and I was awed as I acknowledged that only God, full of power and mystery, could possibly bring such details together over many years and miles.

Now, I just needed to pick up the car, located in Riverdale more than eighty miles away, and get it to Archie. I called the seller to make arrangements. He just "happened" to be driving to Bismarck the next day, and since he owned a trailer, he agreed to haul the car to the body shop. Surprisingly, he still had the original title to the car -- the one with my father-in-law's name.



I chuckled over how all the pieces were falling into place and couldn't help but see God's hand in the connections.

But one more surprise remained for me. Out of curiosity, I asked the seller how he found the Mustang, especially since Riverdale was over seventy miles from Flasher, where Scott lived. He explained that he hounded Scott for two years after he saw the car in an old barn. He'd made the original trip to the barn because he received an out-of-the blue call about a different antique car -- a 1946 Chrysler Windsor. When he was looking at the Chrysler, he saw the Mustang also parked there.

My ears perked up. Eight years earlier, I convinced my father-in-law to sell an old car he inherited when he bought his farm. I had made dozens of phone calls to antique car dealers in order to sell the vehicle. The car? A 1946 Chrysler Windsor. Yes, I was the man who contacted the seller, who now owned the Mustang. Now years later, I bought it back in memory of my deceased wife, to cheer my disabled brother-in-law, and as a present for my father-in-law.

Yes, my journey began with me purchasing the wrong color Nissan Pulsar. But the adventure continued until one very special blue '65 Mustang concluded its long ride home.

Frankly, it took me years to get that done. I've been ripped off by three body shops, so I wound up doing it pretty much in my garage with a friend but we're just not great electrical guys so hard to that point. Yeah, it's not the best paint job, but it's better than what the body shops. They stole thousands of money from me and never did a thing.


