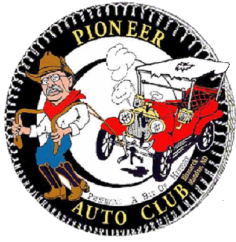

The Quilts of Valor mission is to cover service members & veterans touched by war with comforting and healing Quilts of Valor. On August 5th, two PAC members were honored; Ron Pickar and Darrell Emmil.

Honored to wrap Ron in his quilt were his wife Jan and daughter Ashley. Ron enlisted in the U. S. Air Force and served for six years from March 1973 to March 1977 and two years in the Army Reserves ending in March 1979. He served during the Vietnam War era. His basic training was at Lackland Air Force Base, San Antonio, Texas. His primary duty location was Offutt Air Force Base, Nebraska. He also served at Ellison AFB Fairbanks, Alaska; Mildenhall AFB, England; Kadena AFB, Okinawa, Japan; Hickam AFB, Hawaii and Laken Heath AFB, England.

Ron's primary duty was a Voice Processing Specialist, and his rank was Sergeant E-4. Ron was awarded the Air medal for his service above and beyond. Ron was presented with the State of North Dakota Welcome Home Coin. He is a member of the American Legion. Ron said Offutt Air Force Base was his home base. He was qualified to be an Airborne Voice Processing Specialist Lindquist (Russian) and flew many places for the military. This position is a highly specialized one who intercept and translate real time Russian voice communications to provide critical threat warnings and combat support.

Ron shared when he was on call, he had to go! There was one occasion his dad had to take him to the base, and he was able to watch him get on his plane for his next detail. He pointed out that one of the veterans in attendance was a Navy sailor who served in submarines patrolling below the water while Ron was flying above him serving in the skies.

Ron is proud of his service and would do it all again. He thanked Diana Roloff for the nomination and for making the special quilt.



Honored to wrap Darrell E. in his Quilt of Valor were his sisters: Deb and Denise, his niece Valerie, and his great niece Adison. His quilt was also made for him by Diana Roloff and her husband Don who assisted in selecting the colors of the quilt. Darrell is a Vietnam War era veteran. He enlisted and served in the U. S. Navy for 4 years from February 1969 to February 1973. He did his boot camp at San Diego, California. Darrell's primary duty locations were Sidi Yahia, Morocco, North Africa, and Japan. He served on a destroyer DDG7, the Henry B Wilson, for two months. He also spent time on three different submarines in the North Pacific Ocean with one of those the USS Tautog SSN639. Darrell's primary duty was Intercept Operator, and he had top secret security clearance. His rank and at the time of his honorable discharge was Petty Officer 2nd Class. He is a member of the American Legion and Vietnam Veterans of America. Darrell was presented the State of North Dakota Welcome Home Coin.

Memories shared by Darrell: "My whole time in the service was an adventure for a kid from the Badlands of North Dakota. From being granted a top-secret security clearance and learning some of the nation's most guarded secrets to traveling around the world. From living in Sidi Yahia, Morocco, North Africa and traveling in Africa and Europe to living at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii and living at Misawa, Japan and visiting my favorite city of Tokyo. My job was monitoring Russian naval communications from land and sea. I was on a destroyer DDG7 the Henry B Wilson for 2 months in the North Pacific playing cat and mouse with the Russian Navy. I also spent time on three different submarines in the North Pacific Ocean with the longest time submerged being 82 days. One of these submarines, the USS Tautog SSN639 received notorious mention in the book, "Blind Man's Bluff, the use of Submarines During the Cold War," when it had an underwater crash with a Russian missile submarine, the only time of my service when I was scared." Darrell said one of his duty stations was Morocco where they had a secret base. A surprise for him was the vehicles on the road were donkeys and carts. Darrell also thanked all of his fellow veterans for their service.

Turn on the Cruise! By Don Roloff

So, it appears that I am having a bit of difficulty operating our 2024 Mustang within the posted speed limit!

This is my story based on the features of the Mustang. I was on Burleigh Avenue west of South Washington which is the intersection with the Round About. That section of road is posted at 40 mph and beyond the Round About it changes to thirty-five mph. The thing I noticed is that the car does NOT reduce its speed accordingly. It does corner very well! Therefore, as I exited the Round About at forty mph, I was immediately speeding because the speed limit had been reduced to thirty-five mph.

The other thing I have discovered, when you are driving the speed limit the car has a feature called "creep". The speedometer will gradually increase on its own, also contributing to speeding. This feature you will not notice until it is pointed out to you by a patrol officer. Now when I bought this car none of these interesting features were shown to me by the sales staff. No instruction whatsoever. I was merely learning by doing!

As I was exiting the Round About, Burleigh County Sheriff departments finest noticed the creep feature had kicked in and he pulled me over to inform me of the creep which translated into a speeding ticket. He was very professional and gave me some guidance when driving in the county. Just engage the cruise control to avoid any further creep issues. I paid the ticket and took to heart the officer's recommendation and am using the cruise control on the Burleigh roadways resulting in no additional speeding tickets. It works.

If you have purchased a newer car pay attention to the creep feature to avoid being noticed by Burleigh County's finest, especially if you happen to crack a cold one. Happy motoring!

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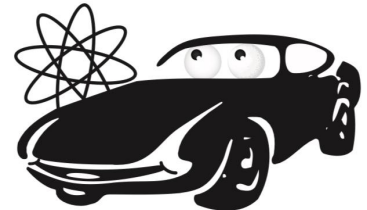
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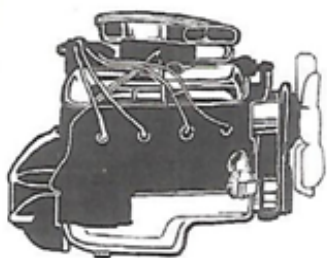
